Message from Our President and Executive Director

At Second Harvest, we measure success in terms of results, whether it is generating food donations, launching a fundraising appeal to keep our trucks and operations running or delivering food to those who are hungry in the communities that we serve. By that definition, this past year has been a successful one.

However, the past year has also been extremely challenging for everyone. Unemployment hit the city hard, food prices increased four times more than inflation – many corporations and individuals had to cut back on charitable support. Unfortunately, the number of people requiring our assistance rose significantly. It's a paradox that at the very same time as the needs in the city increase the resources to address those needs goes down.

Faced with unprecedented challenges, we found:

- **WE ARE ALL CONNECTED.** From the top down, businesses and individuals were hurt by the economic downturn and the social service sector was severely stretched. The agencies we serve saw 20-30% more people go through their doors which resulted in an increased need for more food from us.
- **HOW WE CAN DO MORE WITH LESS.** We introduced *Hunger Squad*, a new program that connects agencies and food donors directly for small pickups by corporate volunteer groups. And by analyzing our route schedules we found increased efficiencies in our daily operations which allowed us to move six new agencies from our waiting list onto our regular delivery schedule, something we are very proud of.

- **ADDED BENEFITS TO OUR WORK.** By diverting nearly six million pounds of food from landfill we prevented over one million pounds of greenhouse gas emissions from entering our atmosphere.
- **HOW DEEPLY COMMITTED OUR SUPPORTERS ARE TO OUR CAUSE.** Food donors, financial donors, in-kind donors, sponsors, volunteers, media partners, and our Board – each one was asked to continue their support while facing their own financial challenges. Throughout this time of struggle, we renewed longstanding partnerships, developed new relationships, saw an increase in individual donors and had more people join *Partners Against Hunger*, our monthly giving program, than ever before.

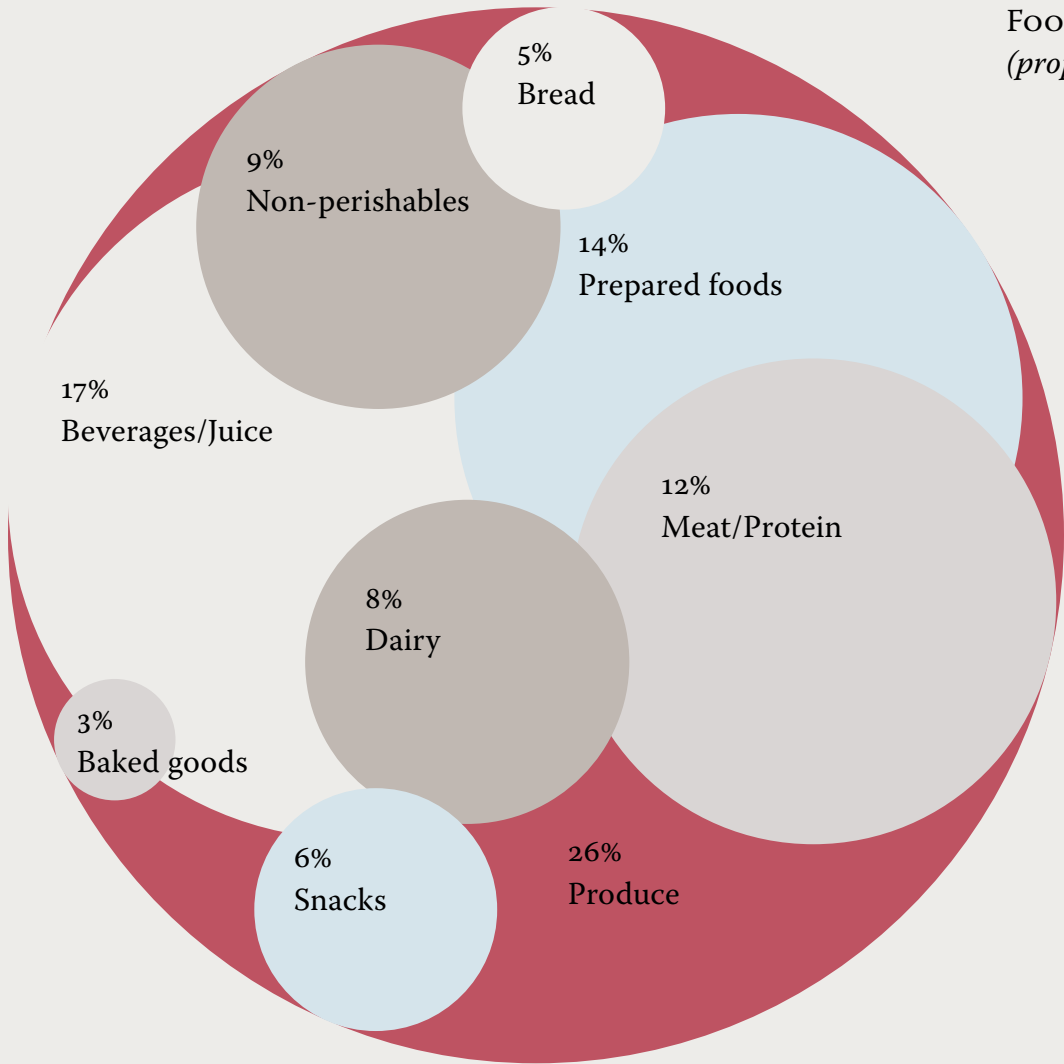
Overall, we have held our own and even managed a small increase in revenue. We realise we have been able to do so thanks to generous individuals and companies who carefully consider the effect of their actions on our community.

Still in challenging times, Second Harvest needs support now as much as ever. We recognize that it is going to take a long time for individuals and communities to recover from the recession. That's why we are working toward creating a five-year plan to provide even more help to those in need in the coming years.

With the enduring commitment of our current supporters and welcoming those who are new to Second Harvest, we will continue to rescue perishable food, and deliver it to agencies feeding those who are hungry. It's simply common-sense.

Food, financial, and in-kind donations combined with thousands of volunteer hours are what keep our trucks on the road every day, providing an essential service to the GTA.

KEY INDICATORS

In addition to our revenue, there are three important financial factors: the value of our food donations, our volunteer hours, and our in-kind donations.

FOOD VALUE

Second Harvest distributed 5.76 million pounds of food last year. Using a value of \$2.00 per pound of food (based on consultation with Food Banks Canada), this food is worth approximately \$11,510,000.

VOLUNTEER HOURS

Second Harvest relies heavily on approximately 1,373 volunteers who volunteer their time over the course of a year. Statistics Canada acknowledges the importance of volunteers by valuing their work at \$17.38 per hour. Our volunteers contributed 14,173 volunteer hours in the last fiscal year, which means our volunteers have saved Second Harvest \$246,327.

IN-KIND DONATIONS

In addition to financial and food donations, many businesses choose to support Second Harvest by donating products or services. In the last fiscal year, these donations were valued at \$1,132,331 which included truck insurance, courier costs, design and print work, and many other gifts, such as the generosity of our event chefs and their suppliers for their endless contributions.
