Hello,

It's been three months since our last update, and in that time Second Harvest has been busy: We've rescued more food than ever before, we've expanded into new communities across Canada and welcomed additional food donors to our organization.

Unfortunately, our continued growth is not an occasion for celebration but is instead a reflection of staggering food insecurity in Canada and an indication of just how much food continues to be wasted every year.

Since September 1, 2022, we've rescued 30.62 million lbs of food, and in the process, we've averted 98.87 million lbs of harmful greenhouse gases from entering the atmosphere – that's equivalent to taking 13,740 cars off the road for a year! Without your support, none of this would be possible.

It's thanks to donors like you that we're able to improve access to nutrition for millions of Canadians and provide much-needed resources to the organizations that support them. You are an important stakeholder in the fight against food insecurity and climate change, and we're proud to have you by our side.

Holliston Pantry Is Feeding Our Future

Holliston Pantry, a 24/7 food cupboard, has been a huge benefit to the community of Saskatoon, Sask. Through Second Harvest's Food Rescue App, they receive readymade meals donated by local food businesses for their school breakfast program.

Second Harvest surveyed more than 1,300 organizations offering charitable food programs, including community food banks and school programs, and found that they expect to serve 60% more people this year, on top of the 134% increase in 2022. This isn't just alarming, it's unnecessary!

People are hungry, and families are feeling the strain to make ends meet. Nicole Ratzlaff from Holliston Pantry said their breakfast program "makes a huge difference to the kids being able to focus on school instead of hunger. Anything unused by the school gets put into the pantry for people to take!" With summer breaks right around the corner and rising grocery prices, your support matters now more than ever.

Thanks to our incredible Harvester community, we can continue to prevent surplus edible food from going to waste and get it on the tables and cafeterias of those who need it most. "Simply put, without food donations, kids would go hungry," Nicole explained. Thank you for helping feed our future, and not landfills.
